





















- Turned 27 this year

 600 k users














Functionalities + context sitting on a tree...








- Functionalities + context sitting on a tree...

 - Clear political vision,
 - Strong community implication from the start.
- Seeds of decline : only one organization



















Decline




- Organization change : more formalized processes
- Increased exploitation load
- Fuzzy political vision :
 RENATER was a beginner in
 service application by then
- => Envisioning a potential structural failure; look for outside contributors
 - => failure, but no time lost





The fall


- A small change : missing lead developer during 6 months

- A story of a missed contribution





























Rebirth?

- « neither the same, nor another »





















We out




- 50 % primitives developed
