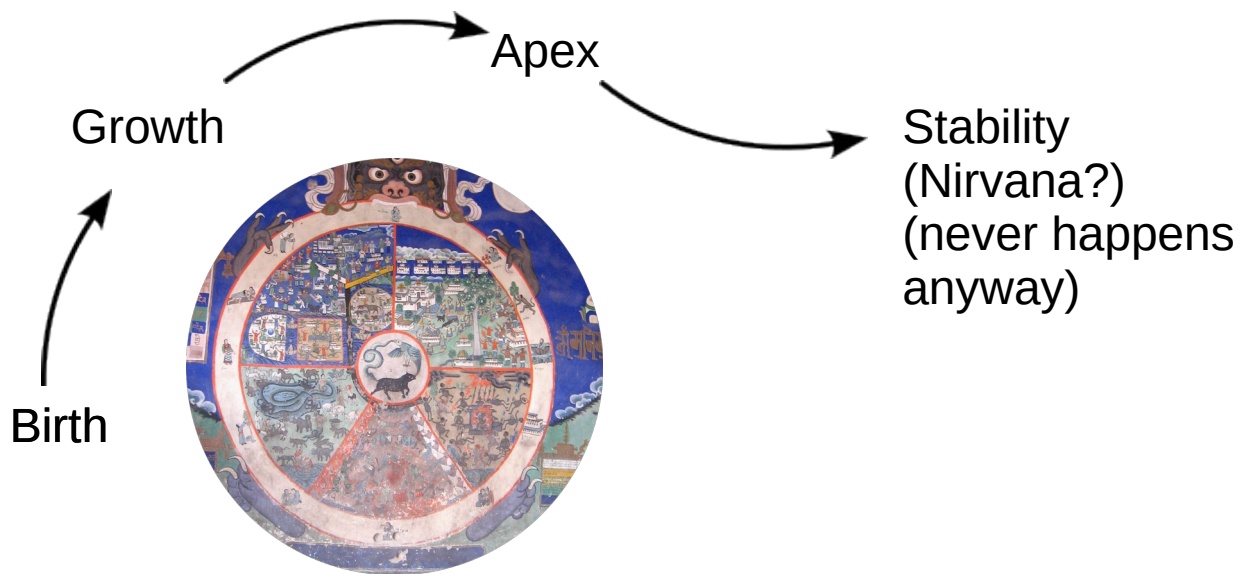


- **Functionalities + context sitting on a tree...**

 - Small team, close to the community,
 - Trusting managers, no interferences with technic,
 - Clear political vision,
 - Strong community implication from the start.
- Seeds of decline : only one organization

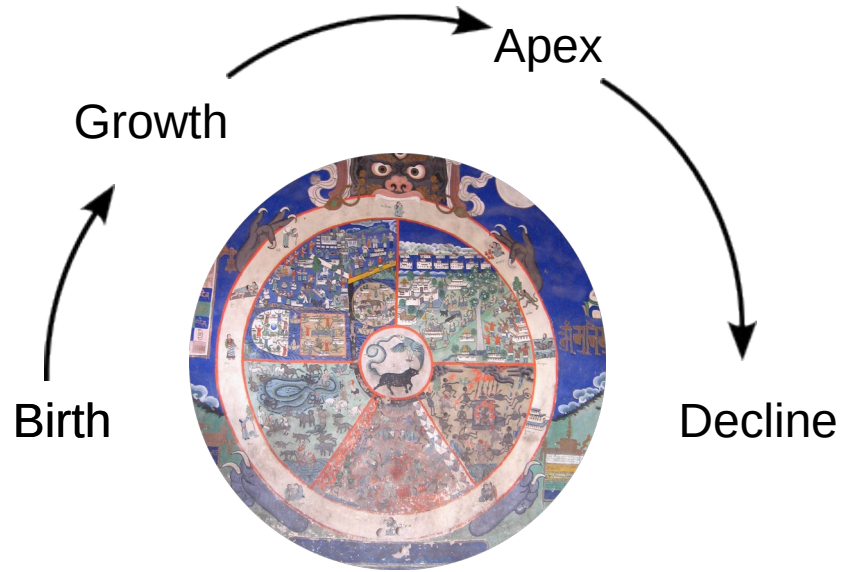

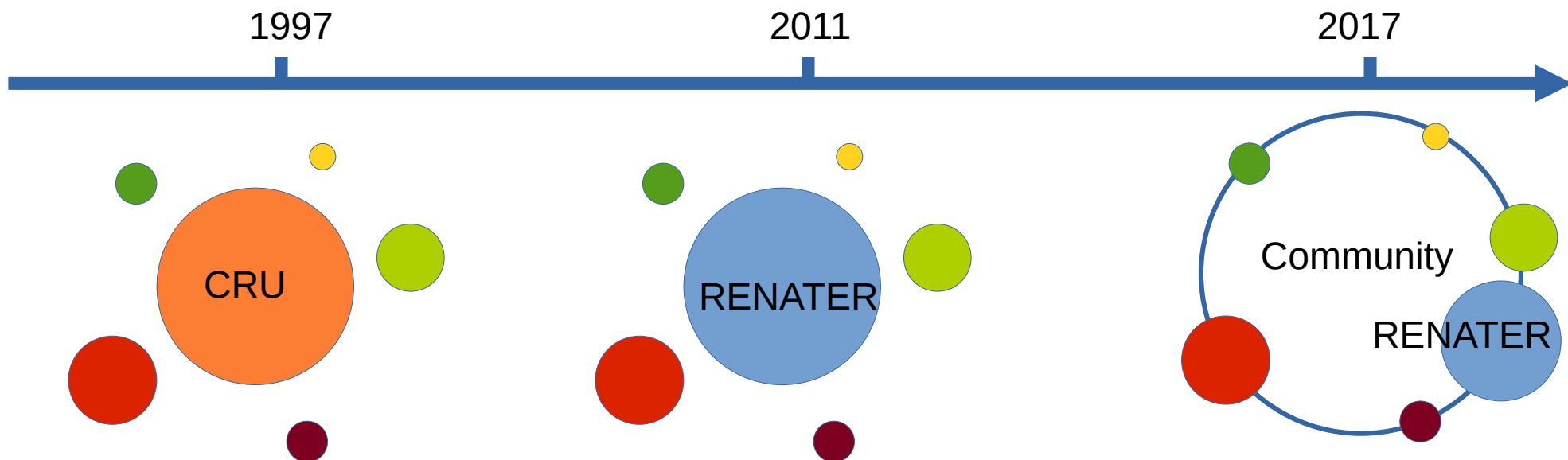
Decline



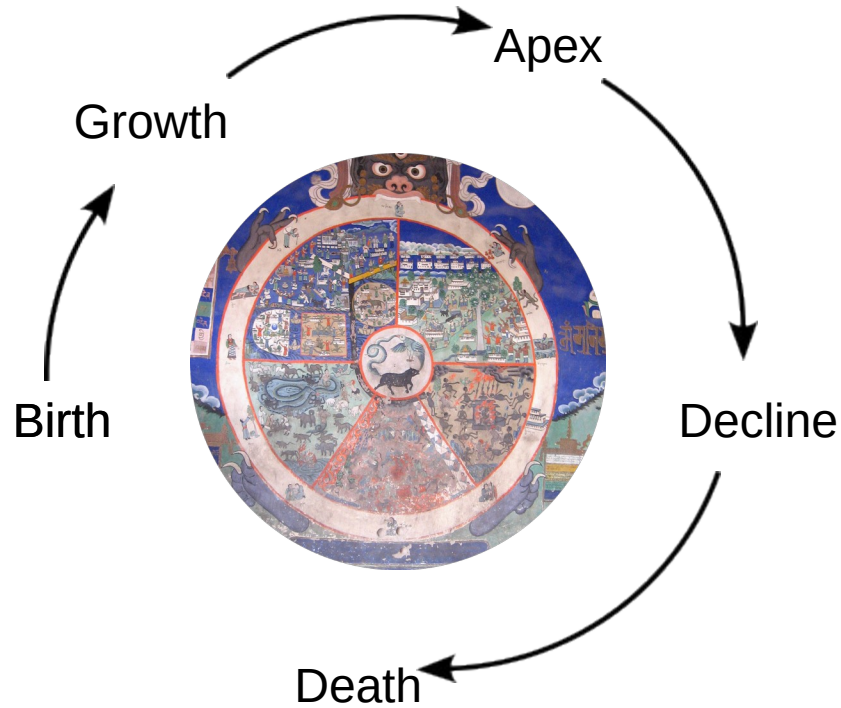
- Organization change : more formalized processes
- Increased exploitation load
- Fuzzy political vision : RENATER was a beginner in service application by then
- => Envisioning a potential structural failure ; look for outside contributors
 - => failure, but no time lost

The fall

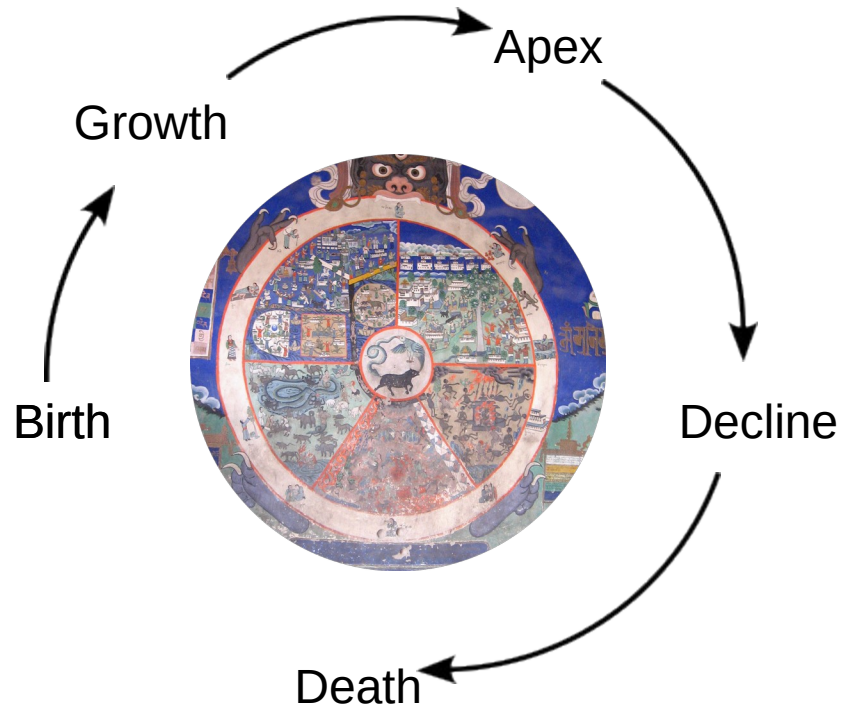


- Community :No governance

- A story of a missed contribution

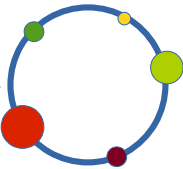
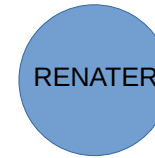

- Make it new paradigm-ready :

 - Docker / S3 / etc.
- Improving existing features
 - S-expressions-based authorization – thanks Roland Edberg !
 - Generalized industrialization mechanism
 - Full group management features

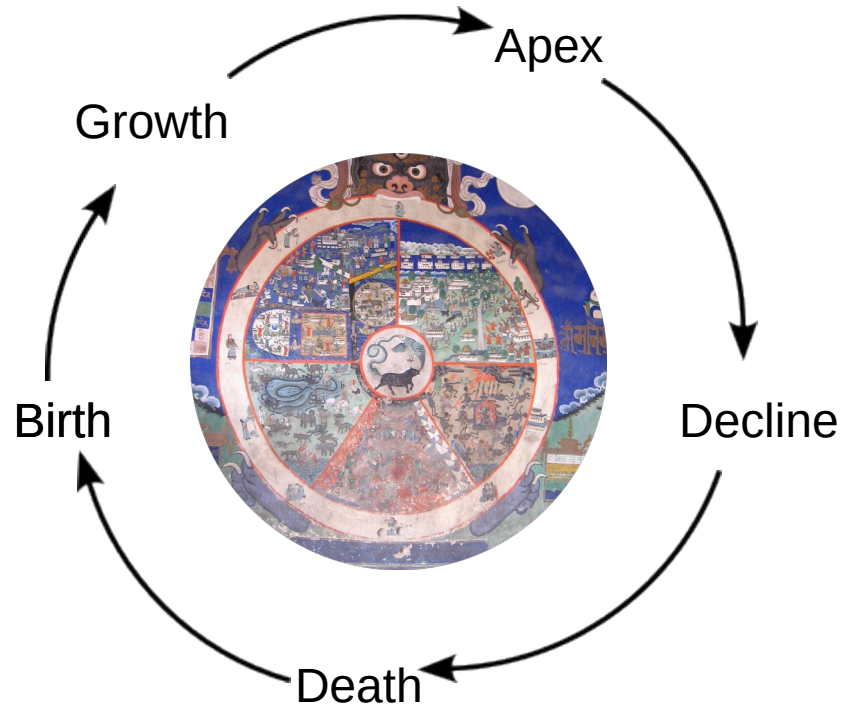
